The Aldermaston Watch camps are taking place in the context of renewed opposition to the UK's nuclear weapons, and public debate following publication of the government's White Paper on Trident replacement.

“An insurance policy”

The government claims that it wants to replace Trident as an “insurance policy” for future generations. What kind of insurance would threaten the very survival of future generations? Help expose the madness of *insurance by annihilation*.

The “unequivocal undertaking”

The government claims to stand by its “unequivocal undertaking to accomplish the total elimination of nuclear weapons” (agreed in 2000), and its commitment to negotiate nuclear disarmament “in good faith.” Help challenge the *do as we say not as we do* theory of nuclear disarmament.

Practical details

- When? from noon on Saturday of the last full weekend of each month; next camps 27/28 January & 24/25 March 2007 (check website or ring to confirm February camp)
- Where? initially meeting at Bluebell wood, near West Gate car park area; if arriving later, ring the camp mobile in case we have moved
- Support? Campers should expect to be self-sufficient in terms of food, camping equipment etc: if you need a tent or sleeping bag, email/phone well in advance. Nearby shops are open until 10/11pm, public toilets are 20 minutes walk away, nearest phone box and bus stop at top of Bishopswood Road, 8 minutes. There are no car parking, water supplies or toilets on-site. At least one person or group with experience in camp(aign)s at Aldermaston will be present for each camp weekend.

The monthly camps aim to ensure a safe atmosphere for everyone, and that no violence or abuse is done to any person. For practical (not moral) reasons, we strongly request:

- no alcohol or drugs other than for medical purposes;
- respect for any agreements made at the camp;
- act safely and responsibly at all times.
